#### 5. DELEGATIONS

Mr. Hoggarth mentioned committee to proceed the meeting with Mr. Todd Nadon – Owner of Fresh market Foods (FMF).

Mr. Van Horne invited Mr. Nadon to discuss more about the food waste and composting options for our community. Mr. Nadon started conversation with **Sustainability**. Sustainability comes with Employee satisfaction. After Employee survey at Fresh market foods (FMF) invested 6 million dollars in accommodations (28 Apartments and 2 houses) on king street for their employees – Subsidized housing for the staff. The other thing Mr. Nadon mentioned about Food security- Food available in the staff room for all the employees, for the Health and wellness FMF have their own private gym, Staff can access free mental health counselors at

any time. In addition, the FMF building new homes near Airport, which way employees can have their own house instead of renting. FMF make things onsite like baking own bread, muffin, meats, bacon, cakes, buns, Smokies, Sausages to reduce logistics and shipping costs. For example, the English muffin produce at Vancouver, which can be much farther to ship the truck of muffins.

All over Canada – 20% food goes to garbage. FMF waste is approximately 3 to 4%, which is the industry standard. FMF initiated charity to Food bank, and planning to launch another initiative by next year with Food bank. Once the product is closer to expiry date, it will go to Food bank so they can distribute it promptly. Ms. Falk pointed about the produce waste. Mr. Nadon answered the produce picked up by 3 farmers on frequently basis and some of the produce goes to dump.

FMF operates retail and online store. Online products delivers to the 28 Northern communities to their doorstep. Airlines come to the back door of the store, pick up the food, and deliver it to Northern communities due to Ecommerce transparency there is no hidden charges. 7 Airlines merged with FMF to delivers the food to up north. Recently, FMF bought a new building to make it as a warehouse for Northern community orders especially with partnership with some of the local businesses. FMF have government license to deliver food and it all transparent to buyers.

Jennifer Esposito – Economic Development officer is working with Mr. Nadon about other composting options. The first thing needs to be done to reduce the food waste is "**Education**" to the staff as 160 people working at the store. FMF is such a diverse organization in our community. Mr. Nadon is interested to educate staff and bring new ideas to a business. The managers will work as coaches, which will help staff to guide and order the food accordingly which can able to reduce food waste to half.

The second thing is "**Technology**" – Many innovations are coming out recently. Mr. Nadon mentioned about "Edge computing", which can allow data to track easily. This will be very helpful to digital pricing, stocking and connected to main POS software to reduce the waste.

Mr. Hoggarth asked about FMF participation in the Mr. Peter Kirby and Doug's pilot program with the help of Municipality of Sioux Lookout. Mr. Nadon expressed interest in the pilot program and decided to connect to Jennifer Esposito regarding this. Committee member were not sure about the staff person who will be responsible for the Pilot program run by Municipality. Ms. Shah will connect with Mr. Brinkman and confirm about the contact person name.

Mr. Van Horne checked about "Cardboard" waste. Mr. Nadon informed the cardboard compactor is located in the back of the store and then deliver back to Winnipeg. Mr. Nadon expressed joy to talk to Environment committee.
