• Update about FoodCyler program

Mr. Brinkman informed the committee about the approval of Foodcycler and mentioned to the Committee about the Ms. Jennifer Esposito, Economic Development Officer will be leading the project. Ms. Esposito will be taking care of registration, promotion, process and forms. Mr. Brinkman added Foodcycler units will be arriving in July and it will be distributed according to first come, first served basis.

Mr. Brinkman define about the cost coverage for small and big units as per below.

FoodCycler FC-30: (Small Unit) Retail Price - \$500

Food Cycle Science Discount - \$200

Impact Canada Investment - \$50

Municipal Subsidy - \$100

Resident/Participant Cost - \$150

FoodCycler Eco 5: (Large Unit)

Retail Price - \$800

Food Cycle Science Discount -\$250

Impact Canada Investment - \$150

Municipal Subsidy - \$100

Resident/Participant Cost - \$300

The initial cost to the Municipality for the purchase of all the FoodCyclers will be \$27,500 plus HST, this includes the estimated shipping cost of \$1,750. The Municipality keeps the money from the sale of the FoodCyclers, once all units are sold the total capital expenditure will be approximately \$10,250 plus HST. The original budgeted amount is \$12,500, with the remaining amount we are looking at purchasing additional filters and accessories for the FoodCyclers. We can get these products at wholesale rates and no additional shipping costs if we purchase in conjunction with the FoodCyclers, Mr. Brinkman mentioned.

The FoodCycler will calculate the food waste for 12 weeks, and the participant can keep it after 12 weeks.
