**5. DELEGATIONS/PRESENTATIONS/COMMITTEE PRESENTATIONS**

- a) Ms. Christine Sawanas was introduced and welcomed to the Police Services Board. Ms. Sawanas was appointed to the Police Service Board by the Lieutenant Governor of Ontario for a period of two years.
- b) Mr. Brian MacKinnon, Municipal Clerk administered Oaths of Office to Mayor Doug Lawrance, Ms. Darlene Angeconeb and Ms. Christine Sawanas as Police Services Board Members pursuant to Ontario Regulation No. 268/10, established under the Police Services Act, R. S. O., 1990, c. P. 15, Part 1 Section 1.

A Terms of Reference and formal Adoption of all motions from previous meetings will be undertaken at a subsequent meeting. The Police Services Board training will be organized for the Board.

**6. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION**

**a) Quarterly Policing Statistics**

- Inspector Davidson presented the First Quarter Policing Statistics Report (January – March 2018). The number of Calls for Service (CFS) has increased from the same time period in 2017. The CFS increases when there are more people in the community.

**b) Call For Services – Frequent Locations**

Inspector Davidson & S/Sgt Duewel provided the following updates:

- In the process of meeting with hotel owners to work with them to reduce CFS from their establishments.
- One hotel has hired private security and their calls for service has decreased significantly.



- A Community Mobilization Officer (CMO) is now in the community. Part of the CMO duties is to work with families to assist individuals who are on the streets to return home.
- There are a lot of homeless people in Sioux Lookout. CFS will be reduced if a Warm-up Shelter, an Emergency Shelter and/or Detox Centre is in the community.
- Just one individual can cause up to four CFS per evening and up to a hundred calls in a year.
- If a person is detained by police for being intoxicated, it is because it is cold out and they have no other place to go.
- Out of 5,500 overnight stays, 4,500 individuals are in for public intoxication and are released with no charges.
- Cost for guarding per year is between \$700,000 and \$800,000. One guard per suicidal individual; which could add up to 7 or 8 guards per shift. The food bill ranges from \$50,000 to \$60,000 per year.

Mayor Lawrance asked if the Board could get a copy of the 2017 Year End Statistics Report, as well as the Kenora Community Justice Centre Needs Assessment Report. These documents would be key tools for negotiating with the Ministry.

It was suggested to explore Bear Clan Patrol in Winnipeg, which consists of a group of people, who patrol the streets and if unconscious individuals (resulting from intoxication) are found and taken to a homeless shelter. S/Sgt Duewel will check with Rachel Garrick, the Community Wellbeing Facilitator from IFNA and also sits on the Anti-Racism Committee, to see if she has more information about the Bear Clan Patrol.

**c) Items arising from the January 30, 2018 Police Services Board Minutes**

- The Library CFS have reduced over the past month. They will need to put policies in place to deal with intoxicated individuals internally, especially during the winter months.
- The Mayor suggested coordinating a meeting in regards to opening a Warm-up Shelter with key stakeholders. The CAO suggested such an investigation should be done strategically. The need for support from all stakeholders involved is essential for its success. This was tried once before through the Economic Development Commission but fell through. The CAO recommended checking with either the Out of the Cold Shelter or the Kenora District Services Board to see if they are interested in taking the lead on such a project.
- The CAO directed the Acting Deputy Clerk to follow up with James Morris, Executive Director of Sioux Lookout First Nations Health Authority to determine if they have had the opportunity to meet with the hotels regarding Calls for Service.
