6. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

a. OPP Third Quarter Report (July-September 2018)

S/Sgt Duewel reviewed the Third Quarter Policing Statistics Report (July – September 2018) with the members. S/Sgt Duewel was happy to report that there have been no Service Complaints since last quarter report. He reported that the number of Patrol Hours is lower than preferred and he will be attending a meeting within a few weeks' time to address this issue with the Sargent to determine if this number is accurate or simply a data entry issue. Violent Crime and Property Crime numbers have decreased while Mischief and Drug related crimes have remained static. S/Sgt Duewel expects that there will be a decrease in possession charges by next report due to the legalization of cannabis.

S/Sgt Duewel stated that the YTD costs, as of September 30, 2018, for 9-1-1 Pocket dials/hang-ups are \$8900. S/Sgt Duewel feels that this increase is due to the number of people who now use cell phones. He also stated that if this trend continues, that amount could reach \$1200 by year end. Mayor Lawrance questioned if an ad campaign would help in decreasing the frequency and therefore the associated costs. S/Sgt stated that he had been in contact with the Petawawa Polices Services Board who have agreed to help in any way and S/Sgt Duewel will be directly in contact with the Clerk to ensure an ad campaign be put in to motion.

b. Status on Sioux Lookout First Nations Health Authority Meeting with Hotels

No information was available for presentation.

Action:

c. Bear Clan Patrol

Ms. Angeconeb stated that WINKS, an interagency youth organization in Sioux Lookout, would be interested in involving local youth with Bear Clan. She stated that this is currently happening in Winnipeg and the youth are conducting street patrol, needle clean up, etc. on certain nights of the week. She has not been able to connect with Rachel Garrick but would like to have a meeting with Rachel Garrick, James Pavel (Founder of Bear Clan), and Mayor Lawrance about establishing a Sioux Lookout Chapter. Ms. Angeconeb is hoping to have this arranged for the week of November 5, 2018. Items she is hoping will be discussed are patrol area, equipment, and headquarters. S/Sgt Duewel suggested involving Susan Barclay, Director of the Out of the Cold Shelter, to take part. He also suggested that a staff member from the OPP be assigned to attend as well.

Action:

- 1) Darlene Angeconeb to notify Mayor Lawrance and S/Sgt Duewel of meeting date and time with James Pavel and Rachel Garrick.

d. Resolutions Passed by SLFNHA—Emergency Shelter & Detox/Treatment Center

Ms. Angeconeb stated that the SLFNHA Chiefs and Assembly have passed resolution for and Emergency Shelter and Detox & Treatment Center for Sioux Lookout. She stated that this resolution shows support for the community and will help to address other issues such as homelessness. Mayor Lawrance stated that KDSB involvement is necessary and the Municipality will push KDSB to spur on project. S/Sgt. Duewel agreed to get a Community Mobilization staff person to try ahead of cold weather and will contact Susan Barclay at the Out of the Cold Shelter as well.

e. Community Safety Plan

Ms. Angeconeb stated that a Community Safety Plan is a mandatory requirement by the government. Mayor Lawrance suggested that it would be an excellent community tool and asked Michelle to follow up on Bill 175 in regards to requirements and timelines.
