5. DELEGATIONS/PRESENTATIONS/COMMITTEE PRESENTATIONS

a. Karen Boyko, Sioux Lookout Seniors' Activity Centre

Karen Boyko attended the meeting on behalf of the members of the Senior's Activity Centre to discuss safety concerns. Karen asked if there is a possibility of a foot patrol or an increase in police presence around the centre as many of the seniors don't feel safe entering or exiting the building due to the groups of people hanging around outside. Karen stated that these groups and individuals solicit the seniors for money and can be intimidating and aggressive at times. They also make it difficult for the seniors to maneuver as they stand on the sidewalk in front of the entranceway and on the corner, forcing the seniors to try to find their way around them. Karen said that she has refrained from calling the police as there hasn't been any specific incident or crime committed, but is hoping that the police can suggest how they can help in this situation. Sgt. Duewel suggested that he and Andrea Degagne, Community Services Officer, could speak to the seniors (possibly at the AGM) which would help to determine the problematic times and make a plan to mitigate the issues and help the seniors feel less fearful and safe. Ms. Boyko will follow up with the OPP.

6. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

a. OPP First Quarter Report (January-March 2019)

Staff Sargent Karl Duewel reviewed the first quarter stats and noted that there has been an increase in foot patrol hours and that this will be an increasing trend. Staff Sgt. Duewel also noted that there has been an increase in fraud crimes; public service ads will be posted to increase public awareness of this issue. Sgt. Duewel stated that billable hours have decreased, as well as violent crime. Theft is still a large problem, the majority of it occurring at the LCBO. He will be meeting with the LCBO manager tomorrow to address the problem. The Mayor requested from the OPP, the Liquor License Act (LLA) offences stats. Staff Sgt. Duewel agreed to forward these to the Mayor for



his review. Dropped 911 calls are still a problem. Staff Sgt. Duewel reviewed the CSO Activity Report. This is the first time that this report has been presented to the committee and Staff Sgt. Duewel asked for feedback. Mayor Lawrance stated that he liked the report and would like it to be left as is. Staff Sgt. Duewel stated that the OPP has received positive feedback on the Community Services Officer position and presence in the community.

Action:

b. Bear Clan Patrol Poster

Darlene noted that the Bear Clan information session is still in the works and she will forward information as details are confirmed. The tentative date is scheduled for May 22, 2019.

c. Andrea Degagne, Community Services Officer-Rec Centre

Michelle Larose spoke about issues at the Recreation Centre with problematic youth. She would like to meet with the CSO, Andrea Degage to determine if there is any opportunity to make these youth accountable for their actions through community service, etc.

The next Regular Police Service Meeting will be held on Wednesday, July 17th, 2019 at 1:00 p.m. in the Municipal Council Chambers.


