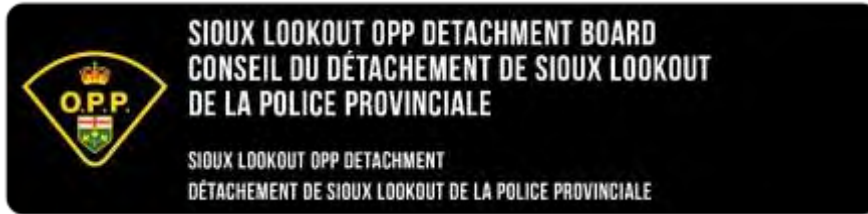

1. CALL MEETING TO ORDER – Darlene Angecone, Chair

Inspector Kreiszi introduce Paige Parker as the new Victim Specialist in Sioux Lookout:

Ms. Parker's role is to apply an investigative lens and to provide updates to victims and next of kin throughout the investigation. This position helps build trust and identify the needs of our victims or survivors.

a. OPP Report/Statistics for the Fourth Quarter, October – December 2025 for Sioux Lookout and Pickle Lake

Inspector Kreiszi presented the Fourth Quarter Statistics for Pickle Lake and Sioux Lookout to the Board. In addition to various statistics highlighted by Inspector Kreiszi, the following were of note:

Pickle Lake

Community Outreach

138 community service events were completed by Pickle Lake officers in 2025.

- School Breakfast Program
- OPP Cops and Kids Ice Fishing Derby
- Santa Claus parade
- Fun with Cops after school program
- OPP Kids in the Know program (also throughout the cluster): Prevention-based safety program teaching kids how to recognize and respond to unsafe situations. Building positive relationships between youth and the police.

Calls For Service Billing Summary Report:

- Overall, CFS are up slightly in 2025 versus 2024. The increases are across most billing categories.

Violent Criminal Code:

- The assault numbers are up. After review, the common themes involved parties that were all intoxicated and knew each other prior to the assault at the visited location. Help connect these victims to our Victim Specialist Paige Parker.

Property Crime Violations:

- Overall, the numbers are slightly down, with Mischiefs trending up. Most of these cases involved the destruction of property known to the people committing these acts.

Operational:

- Bear Calls are back up in 2025. They are working with the township on garbage disposal, and there is room for improvement to reduce calls in 2026.
- Assist Public Calls are down. This category is usually our catch-all for people who call and are not fit for other billable categories
- Domestic Disturbances are up this year due to the good work of our Detachment Abuse Issues Investigator now doing a better job of categorizing them as being domestic.

Statutes & Acts:

- Mental Health Threats of Suicide are up. Our CMHA Crisis Response worker is doing a good job connecting with people in crisis and has had a number of individuals at the Situation Table in Sioux Lookout.

Detachment Board Clearance Rate

- Clearance rate in Pickle Lake continues to be one of the highest in the Province, with 92.9% clearance rate for Violent Crime and a 61.9% for Property Crime.

Drugs

- No overdose occurrences were recorded in Pickle Lake for 2025. This statistic points the focus towards alcohol that contributes to the greatest number of negative outcomes.

Sioux Lookout**Community Outreach**

Staff Sergeant Saudino introduced the community service events/initiatives of 2025 in Sioux Lookout.

- New position of Community Engagement Officer filled by Provincial Constable Graham Desjarlais. One of his duties is to participate in community service events and represent the OPP.
- National Law Enforcement Day
- Coffee with Cops event at Tim Horton
- Recruiting efforts at Career Fair in Pelican Falls
- OPP Kids in the Know Program
- Emergency Response Team Training for lockdown procedures with staff at the Sioux Mountain Public School

Calls For Service Billing Summary Report:

- Overall, CFS are trending down in 2025 versus 2024.

Violent Criminal Code:

- Aggravated Assaults are up, and after review, they have all been solved, and charges were laid. These cases are also individuals known to each other, where consuming alcohol in excessive quantities is involved.
- Sexual Assaults are down for the third consecutive year.

Property Crime Violations:

- Break and Enter and Mischiefs are down due to an increase in private home security systems.

Other Criminal Code Violations:

- Bail Violations are up. Our Offender Management and Apprehension Program continue to monitor offenders who are on conditions. In 2025, OPP Officers across the cluster have conducted 1,020 offender compliance checks.

Operational:

- We can see the most significant reduction of Calls for Service with 15% decrease in our Operational category. This is because the Assist Public Calls are mainly minor calls that don't fit into any other category.

Statutes & Acts:

- Increase in the Mental Health Suicidal Threats. With our partnership with the Canadian Mental Health Association, we are getting a new in-house Mobile Crisis Response worker with the position getting posted in the next week.

Detachment Board Clearance Rate

- Clearance rate in Sioux Lookout is also high, with 85.4% for Violence Crime clearance rate and 61.4% for Property Crime clearance rate.

Youth Charges

- Significant decrease in 2025. After looking into it, several young people who were charged are no longer in the community or are now adults and have moved into another category, but OPP is actively monitoring the cause of this reduction.

b. Email from OAPSB re New Year Update on Legislative Changes and Discussion Groups Now Open

Inspector Kreis� provided an overview update on the Provincial Impaired Driving Legislation.

- There are now longer immediate roadside suspensions if you “blow a warning” at the roadside. Previously, the first occurrence was a 3-day license suspension, and the second was a 7-day license suspension. It has now changed to a 7-day suspension on the first occurrence and a 14-day licence suspension on the second.
- Another change is Early Mandatory Education and Treatment. The first occurrence requires completion of a Remedial Education Program, and subsequent occurrences require more intensive treatment programming. Drivers must complete these programs before full driving privileges are restored.

These changes set a clear message that impaired driving now carries quicker, longer and more impactful consequences, and some of these are delivered right at the roadside, not just months later once the court process is concluded.

c. Inspector General of Policing, Memo #9: Province-Wide Inspection on Police Integrity and Anti-Corruption Practices

Mr. MacKinnon informed the Board that the focus of this memo is a province-wide initiative rising from the news of the city force in Toronto. There is no direct relation or connection to the Sioux Lookout OPP Detachment Board.

TITLE: 2025-2026 Annual Report to Municipalities

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT the Sioux Lookout OPP Detachment Board approves the Board portion of the 2025-2026 Annual Report to the Municipalities of Pickle Lake and Sioux Lookout, per Section 68(1)(f) of the Community Safety and Policing Act, provided by Staff (covering activities from approximately May 2025 – May 2026); and further

THAT, when the Sioux Lookout Detachment Commander's portion of the Annual Report is received, it be reviewed by the Board at a meeting; and further

THAT, once both portions of the Annual Report are finalized and consolidated, the full and final report be forwarded to the Councils of the Township of Pickle Lake and the Municipality of Sioux Lookout for their information.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this report is to provide the Board with an opportunity to:

1. Review the Board's portion of the Annual Report covering Board activities from approximately May 2025 to May 2026;
2. Determine how the Annual Report will be provided to the Municipalities of Pickle Lake and Sioux Lookout.

BACKGROUND:

Section 68(1)(f) of the Community Safety and Policing Act (CSPA) requires that an OPP Detachment Board shall "on or before June 30th in each year, provide an annual report to the municipalities and band councils regarding the policing provided by the detachment in their municipalities or First Nation reserves."

DISCUSSION:

In order to comply with the legislation and, based on advice previously provided by our Policing Advisor at the Inspectorate of Policing and the Ontario Association of Police Service Boards (now Police Governance Ontario), Staff has prepared a report detailing the Board's activities from approximately May 1, 2025 to May 2026 for the Board's review.

The OPP Detachment Commander is also in the process of preparing the Detachment's portion of the report. Once it is received, the Board can review it at its next regular meeting, August 28th, or a Special Meeting can be called for this purpose. Once this is completed, the full and final report will be provided to the Councils of Pickle Lake and Sioux Lookout for their information. We may not be able to meet the June 30th deadline; however, some leeway has been provided by the Province in this regard.

The Board also needs to determine how to "provide" the report to the Municipalities of Pickle Lake and Sioux Lookout. As was done with the 2024-2025 Annual Report, Staff recommends that the full Annual Report be sent to the Municipalities for their information and they can process it as they see fit.

Since the First Nations communities have opted out of participating on the Board, the Board does not have to provide the report to the First Nations communities.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS: There are no financial implications for preparation of the report other than Staff time.

SIOUX LOOKOUT OPP DETACHMENT BOARD ANNUAL REPORT: May 2025 – May 2026 DETACHMENT BOARD ACTIVITIES

INTRODUCTION

The Ontario *Community Safety and Policing Act* (CSPA), passed in 2019, came into force on April 1, 2024. Among many other changes, the new legislation significantly changed how policing is provided in Ontario and “converted” several existing Police Services Boards (PSBs) to regional “OPP Detachment Boards”.

Municipalities with their own police forces retain the slightly amended “Police Service Boards” under the Act.

Policing in the Township of Pickle Lake and the Municipality of Sioux Lookout (in addition to four first Nations communities) is provided by the Sioux Lookout OPP Detachment. Both Municipalities had PSBs under Section 10 of the former *Police Services Act*, which was repealed by the CSPA. The new Act and O.Reg. 135/24 have prescribed that the Township of Pickle Lake and the Municipality of Sioux Lookout must work together to form the new “Sioux Lookout OPP Detachment Board” to implement the requirements of the legislation.

(NOTE: The four First Nations communities policed by the Sioux Lookout OPP Detachment have opted out of participating on or contributing to the operating costs of the new Board. This has been sanctioned by the Ministry of the Solicitor General.)

Section 68 of the CSPA sets out the Roles and Responsibilities of the Board. One of those responsibilities is to provide an Annual Report to the Municipalities regarding the policing provided by the Detachment in their Municipalities on or before June 30th each year. Since the legislation came into force on April 1, 2024, and most, if not all, new Detachment Boards were in the very early stages of establishment, onboarding, and implementation, there would have been little to report on by June 30, 2024. Therefore, the initial Annual Report covered activities of the new Sioux Lookout OPP Detachment Board from late October 2023 to May 2025.

In late April 2025, the OPP's Strategy Management Unit advised of the timeline for activities and creation of the OPP's portion of the Annual Report. Because this was the first Annual Report of the new Detachment Board (and all new Detachment Boards across the Province), flexibility with regard to deadlines was allowed by the Province. The OPP portion of the report was received by the Board's Administrator on August 8th. The Board then needed time to review the report, which was completed at its August 28, 2025, meeting; thus, the presentation of the first Annual Report to the Councils of Sioux Lookout and Pickle Lake didn't occur until approximately September 2025, after the June 30th original deadline, and in accordance with the OPP's Strategy Management Unit's guidance.

This report covers the activities of the Sioux Lookout OPP Detachment Board from approximately May 2025 to May 2026.

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT the Sioux Lookout OPP Detachment Board authorizes Darlene Angeconeb to attend the Police Service Board (PSB) Chair Meeting, June 10, 2026, in Thunder Bay, Ontario, with necessary expenses allowed, in accordance with the Board's Rules and Procedures.

PURPOSE: The purpose of this report is for the Sioux Lookout OPP Detachment Board to consider sending the Board Chair member to the Police Service Board (PSB) Chair Meeting, June 10, 2026, in Thunder Bay, Ontario, and to approve the expenditure.

BACKGROUND:

The new Ontario Community Safety and Policing Act (CSPA or the Act), passed in 2019, came into force on April 1, 2024. Among many other changes, the new legislation has significantly changed how policing is provided in Ontario and has "converted" several existing Police Services Boards (PSBs) to regional "OPP Detachment Boards" (DBs) comprising more than one municipality.

Policing in the Township of Pickle Lake and the Municipality of Sioux Lookout (in addition to four First Nations communities) is provided by the Sioux Lookout OPP Detachment. Both Municipalities had PSBs under Section 10 of the Police Services Act, which has been repealed

The new Act and O.Reg. 135/24 have stipulated that the Township of Pickle Lake and the Municipality of Sioux Lookout form a new joint OPP Detachment Board. Therefore, the Township of Pickle Lake and the Municipality of Sioux Lookout must work together in order to implement the requirements of the legislation.

This year, the OPP is hosting a Police Service Board Chair Meeting presented by Chief Superintendent Bryan MacKillop & OAPSB Zone 1 Director John McTaggart. The Chair of the Sioux Lookout OPP Detachment Board has received an invitation to attend, and the Board has the capacity and budget to accept it, provided the Board Chair is available.

The PSB Chair Meeting's intent is to create a dedicated forum for meaningful discussion on key provincial priorities impacting Police Service Boards and policing operations. The meeting will provide an opportunity for PSB Chairs and senior leadership to engage on topics such as provincial initiatives, governance considerations, regional and northern realities, and emerging priorities that support a consistent understanding and alignment across Police Service Boards.

DISCUSSION:

The Board may wish to consider sending the Board Chair, Darlene Angeconeb, to the Meeting.

Based on our experience with past trainings and meetings from related organizations, it is expected that useful information will be shared at the Meeting, and the Board Chair will have the opportunity to network with Chairs and senior leadership members of other Detachment Boards and Police Service Boards in the Province to obtain other perspectives.

An Agenda for the Meeting will be circulated closer to the meeting date.

Based on the Board's Rules and Procedures regarding Travel Expenses, anticipated expenses are outlined, and various scenarios are presented in the attached document entitled "2026 PSB Chair Meeting Costing and Options."

In accordance with the Board's Rules and Procedures, to maximize the value of attendance at events, the Board Chair shall provide a report (verbal or written) that includes highlights of the Meeting attended at the next scheduled Detachment Board meeting. The report should also include proposals for any actions/ideas for the Board's consideration that the attendee believes could be implemented by the Board/Staff to increase its effectiveness.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The estimated total cost to send one Board Chair is approximately \$1,856.28 based on Scenario 1, Option 2 of flying from Sioux Lookout to Thunder Bay.

The Board's Travel/Training/Professional Development Budget for 2026 is of \$7,000. However, the Board's planned attendance was limited to two events: OAPSB Spring Conference & AGM and the OAPSB Zone 1 Meeting. To accommodate the costs for these events, as well as the PSB Chair Meeting, the Board will be required to reallocate funds to the Travel/Training budget line.

Prior attendance of a Board Member to the 2026 OAPSB Conference & AGM in June 2026, left a remaining budget of approximately \$2,372.77 for Travel/Training, which will cover the costs of attendance by the Board Chair at the PSB Chair Meeting. The remaining amount of \$516.49 and the relocation funds from our Insurance line of

\$1,341.06 to Travel/Training will cover the OAPSB Zone 1 Meeting in November 2026 for one Board/Staff Member to attend, which is expected to cost \$1,856.28.

SUBJECT: Inspector General Memo #10: Province-Wide Inspection on Police Integrity and Anti-Corruption Practices Update

I am writing to provide an update on the province-wide inspection on police integrity and anti-corruption practices that I initiated in February 2026.

This afternoon, I will publicly announce the appointment of the **Honourable William Hourigan** as an inspector under the *Community Safety and Policing Act* to lead this inspection. In this role, Mr. Hourigan has the legal authority to obtain all information required to conduct the inspection, which will proceed in accordance with the Terms of Reference I have established (which are attached to this IG Memorandum).

Mr. Hourigan brings extensive experience in law and public service, having served on the Ontario Court of Appeal and the Ontario Superior Court of Justice, and having led significant independent inquiries and statutory reviews for government, including in the area of policing and police governance. I am grateful he has agreed to carry out this inspection.

In addition to the Terms of Reference, enclosed with this IG Memorandum is a letter from Mr. Hourigan that introduces the inspection, explains its system-focused approach, and outlines how he and his team will engage as the inspection unfolds. In the coming weeks, Mr. Hourigan's team will be in contact to begin this engagement, and further information will be shared as the inspection moves forward.

The appointment of Mr. Hourigan to lead this inspection, and the establishment of the Terms of Reference that will guide the work, represent an important next step in advancing the commitment I outlined in February to maintain public confidence in Ontario's policing system.

I appreciate your cooperation and engagement as this work moves forward.
